Eva's Turns Youth Homelessness into Home

Youth experiencing homelessness who are Black, Indigenous, 2SLGBTQ+, racialized, or newcomers are overrepresented in the population of youth experiencing homelessness. In Canada, racism, specifically anti-Black and anti-Indigenous racism, permeates society, creating social and health inequities.

To respond to the needs of homeless youth and decrease social and health inequities experienced by Black, Indigenous and racialized youth, culturally responsive supports, and services must be provided. These supports center the identities and cultures of young people and affirms their holistic identity, taking into consideration the barriers they navigate in their daily lives.

This ensures that services respond to the specific needs of youth instead of compounding the barriers they are already facing.

Eva's provides shelter, transitional housing, and health and well-being programming to help youth experiencing or at risk of homelessness in Toronto. Join our expert staff to help young people reach their potential and lead fulfilling, healthy lives.

At Eva's, we help young people move from crisis to stability with the goal of moving to independence. We collaborate with each young person to develop an achievable action plan, attain their goals, and build strong community connections.

ROLE OVERVIEW

The Housing Support Worker position reports to the Housing Manager. This position works in a shelter environment with its associated stresses and with youth who may at-times be in crisis and may demonstrate related behaviors.

RESPONSIBILITIES

The Housing Support Worker position is responsible for development and delivery of programs that support Eva's youth residents in transitioning to independent living. These sessions may include income stabilization; subsidized and market rent housing searches; government applications; community referrals; education on tenancy and rental issues. This position is also required to support residents to move into suitable accommodation as well as provide follow-up resources post move-out to ensure smooth transition to independent living. Responsibilities include the development and delivery of life skills programs and

group sessions aimed at independent living; education regarding rental and accommodation issues; for profit and non-profit housing opportunities.

QUALIFICATIONS

- Bachelor's Degree or College Diploma in a related field (Social Work, Child and Youth Work, Social Services) or relevant mix of education and experience
- Minimum 2 years work Experience in case management and Housing First model working with vulnerable youth including those with mental health challenges, preferably in a residential setting.
- Demonstrated knowledge of Anti-Black racism principles and ability to utilize anti-oppressive frameworks to develop rapport with youth with intersectional identities with a particular focus on Black youth.
- Extensive knowledge of housing specific resources, referral, and application processes
- Demonstrated understanding of the Residential Tenancy Act, Eviction processes and Landlord Tenant Board
- Experience in facilitating workshops and coordinating housing supports program delivery.
- Excellent organizational, and time management skills
- Strong interpersonal, written, and verbal communication skills
- Excellent administrative skills, experience drafting reports that include evaluation data/analysis
- Effective computer skills including MS Office, Outlook, Excel, MS Teams, etc.
- Class "G" valid driver's license
- Legally entitled to work in Canada

SALARY

This position is unionized, the wage rate is \$25.36 per hour for 40 hours per week with a comprehensive benefits package.
