Eva's assists more than 200 young people every day with your generous support, providing essential skills development and vital community connections for a brighter future.

Our 2023 Youth Survey results highlight a notable rise in Black, newcomer, and 2SLGBTQ+ youth accessing services at Eva's.

Your generosity enables Eva's to deliver targeted supports that are urgently needed for groups that are disproportionately impacted by youth homelessness. Together, we are breaking down barriers and providing culturally responsive and trauma-informed programming that caters to the unique needs of Black youth, while also remaining open to all.

*A refugee is an individual compelled to leave their homeland due to persecution, war, or violence.
A refugee claimant is someone within Canada who seeks protection by making a claim for refugee status.

An increasing number of newcomers are coming to Canada, seeking shelter from war, violence, persecution, human rights abuses, and environmental disasters.

About the survey

This is a moment-in-time snapshot of the youth seeking our services. 120 youth completed the survey, covering our emergency shelters (Place and Satellite Hotel) and transitional housing site (Phoenix). The survey does not capture YOUth Belong participants, where 100% self-identify as Black, a requirement of the program.

"For a lot of our youth, their first stop after getting off the plane is Eva's Satellite. They simply have nowhere else to go. Some are as young as 17 or 18 and may be fleeing persecution, forced marriages, or other harms. They are leaving everything behind and starting from scratch."

Building a foundation for success

60% of youth have at least some high school education

14% of youth have at least some college education

16% of youth have at least some university education

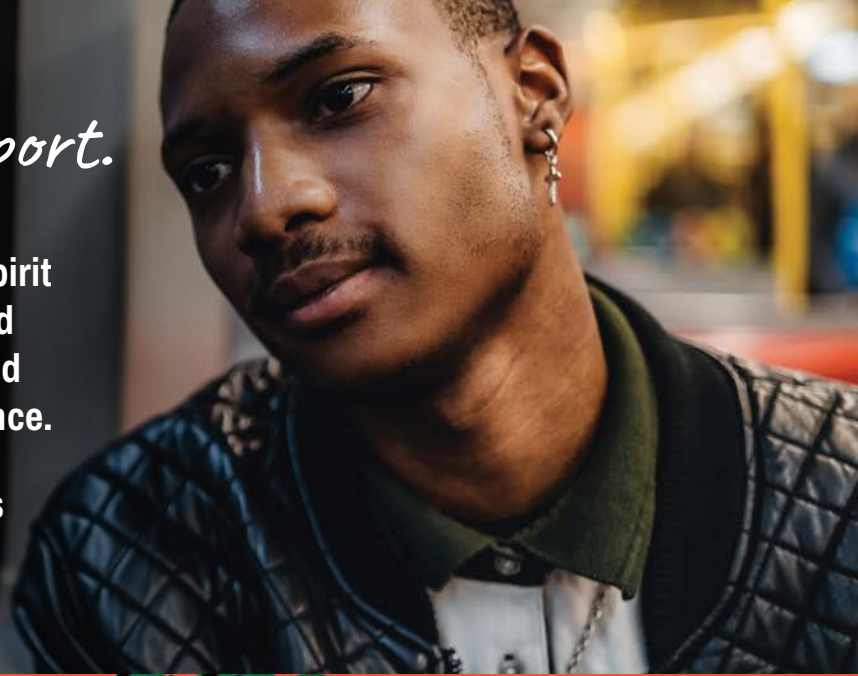

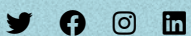
